



BOW HUNTING CHECKLIST

Hunters must supply the following documents:

1. Seven Hills deer control permit application
2. Proof of passing archery test
3. Present and provide a photocopy of Ohio Hunting License
4. Present and provide a photocopy of deer permit
5. Completed Seven Hills archery agreement signed by property owners and hunters
6. Present and provide a Photocopy of Ohio driver's license or state identification
7. Map showing proposed hunting property with property boundaries and platform location
8. Non-refundable Hunting fee of \$55 for non-resident of Seven Hills and \$28 for residents of Seven Hills. Cash and checks are accepted. Make checks payable to the City of Seven Hills. Payment to be delivered to the Seven Hills Finance Department. Proof of payment must accompany your application.
9. Completed Building acreage form.
10. Completed Platform inspection form.
11. No deer applications will be accepted after December 31st.

Pursuant to the City of Seven Hills' Ordinance No. 505.11, Hunting, the Chief of Police hereby establishes the following Rules and Regulations for the issuance of a Deer Control Permit:

A. Preapproval process:

1. Application, a copy of which is attached, must be completed and submitted as follows:
 - a. Municipal deer control hunting permit application shall be submitted no later than one month from the last day of the Ohio Bow Hunting Season (September-February);
2. Applicant must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Police Chief or his designated representative the following:
 - a. Applicant is a qualified archer;
 - b. Applicant and/or landowner has been issued either a deer damage control permit and/or hunting license and deer permit as required by ODNR;
 - c. Applicant's acknowledgement of bow-hunting only (long bow and crossbow) of white-tailed deer;
 - d. Provide written permission (affidavit) from the property owners (minimum 2.25 contiguous acres for a limited period of time as set forth in the permit;
3. Hunting shall be conducted from an elevated platform only. The platform and its location shall be inspected and approved by the Chief of Police or his designee prior to the permit issuance;
4. Applicant shall provide a map, with boundaries outlined on the map of the property or properties of the approved site/platform;
5. Approval/certification from an approved archery proficiency test site, valid Ohio hunting license, or successful completion of Ohio Hunter safety course, if applicable, and all other state requirements;
6. Compliance with all laws, rules and regulations of the City and State of Ohio;
7. All applicants shall agree, in writing, to defend and indemnify the City for any negligent or other acts committed by the applicant;
8. Any person obtaining a permit under this chapter and any property owner giving written permission for deer hunting on the owner's property shall have consented to the entry upon the outdoor property by Police Officers or Wildlife Officers to enforce the provisions of this chapter. This is to clarify that this does not give blanket permission to enter property owners house.
9. Payment of the registration fee.

B. Issuance of Permit/Post approval requirements:

1. After the Chief of Police or his designee has visited the property and determined that hunting with archery equipment can be safely conducted on the property and that the applicant is a qualified archer, the Chief of Police may issue a permit or may impose any other requirements, conditions or

restrictions as deemed necessary to preserve and protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents as determined solely by the Chief of Police;

2. The Chief of Police's decision to grant or deny a permit application in a final decision which is not appealable.
3. Permit holder shall post "caution archery hunting" signs if deemed necessary by the Chief of Police;
4. Deer permit shall be used only by the named permit holder;
5. Deer permit shall be valid only during the dates specified on the Permit and only during daylight hours;
6. Permit holder shall remove all deer carcasses and deer remains from the hunting site;
7. All harvested deer must be timely reported to the ODNR, website at wildlife.ohio.dnr.gov or by calling 1-877-TAGITOH (1-877-824-4864).
8. All hunters must contact the Seven Hills Police Department (216-524-4423) no later than two weeks after the end of the hunting season to report all harvested animals (number and sex of animal).
9. Chief may terminate/cancel the permit within his sole discretion and without the obligation to give any reason therefor.

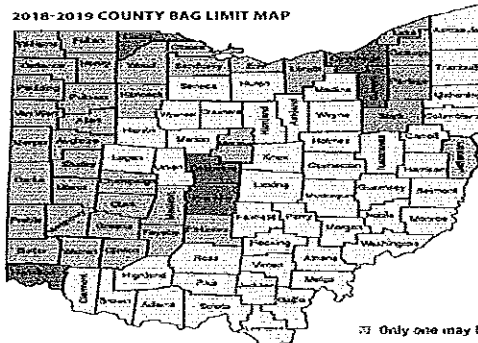

Summary of Harvest Opportunities in Seven Hills

2018-2019 Deer Hunting Season

The City of Seven Hills has been granted "Controlled Hunt Status" by the Chief of the Division of Wildlife for the 2018-2019 deer hunting season. This allows any hunter hunting within Seven Hills for the 2018-2019 hunting season to harvest up to six (6) antlerless deer utilizing either antlerless or either-sex tags as part of their statewide controlled hunt bag limit. The information below will assist you in understanding how this applies to hunting in Seven Hills.

2018-2019 COUNTY BAG LIMIT MAP



Additional restrictions apply when hunting deer on public land. See page 7 for more information.

Types of Bag Limits You Can Use

There are two types of bag limits you can utilize in Seven Hills:

Controlled hunt bag limit (limit of 6 statewide)

&

County bag limit (varies by county, see map above)

***** Note: When you check in your deer the system will ask if you are checking it as a controlled hunt deer or not *****

Max bag limit in Seven Hills = 10

6 antlerless deer checked in as a controlled hunt deer
(Deer taken in Seven Hills may be considered and checked as a controlled hunt deer)

+

1 antlerless deer checked before Nov. 28 using an antlerless permit & 3 either sex permits checked during any season

OR

4 either sex permits during any season

Max number of antlered deer statewide = 1

No more than 1 antlered deer may be killed during the 2018-2019 season regardless of where or how it was taken.

Tips for Checking In Your Seven Hills Deer

- If you kill an antlerless deer prior to Nov 27th in Seven Hills, make sure you check it as your one antlerless deer for that county (do not check it as a controlled hunt deer when prompted by the check in system).
- Antlerless permit sales end on Nov. 26th, so if you plan to use the antlerless permit you must purchase them no later than the 26th. However, either-sex permits can be purchased and used in place of antlerless permits and are available all season long.
- You can only check in 6 deer as controlled hunt deer for the 2018-2019 hunting season. If you kill deer in another controlled hunt in Ohio other than in Seven Hills, those deer DO count towards your controlled hunt bag limit of 6 deer.
- The statewide bag limit (NOT counting controlled hunt deer) is 6 deer for the 2018-2019 hunting season. Deer from Seven Hills checked as part of your county bag limit DO count towards your statewide bag limit of 6 deer.

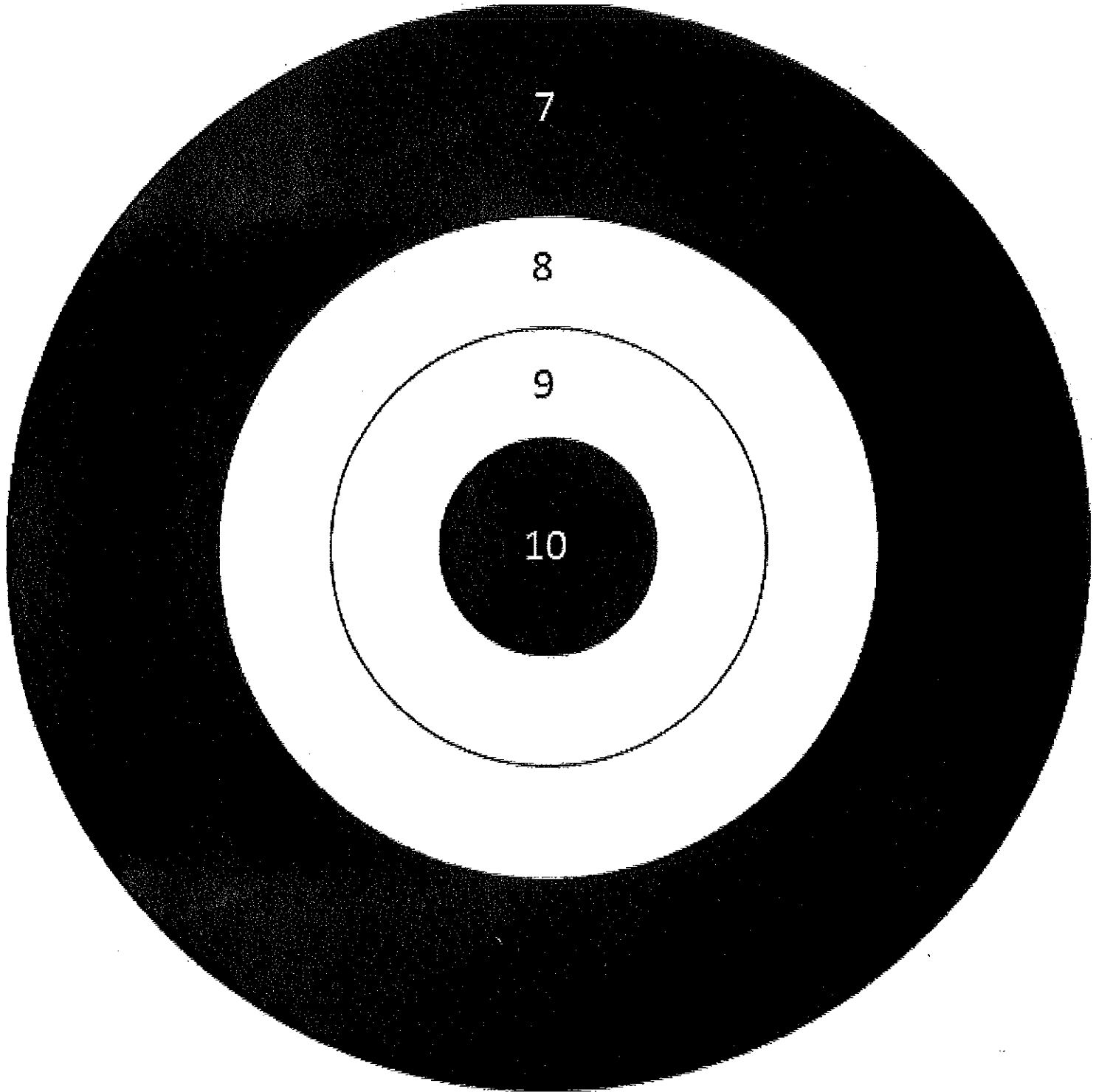

Permit Conditions

(For Hunter and Property Owner)

1. The hunter must possess a copy of this permit as well as any applicable State of Ohio Licenses, permits, and/or tags while operating under this permit, and must adhere to any Division of Wildlife and City of Seven Hills rules and regulations. If requested by a Law Enforcement Official or State Wildlife Official, the person operating under this permit must produce this permit upon request.
2. The hunter must ensure that all equipment used while operating under this permit must be removed from the area covered under this permit no later than two weeks after the expiration of this permit, including but not limited to tree stands and ladders.
3. Hunting shall be conducted from an elevated platform 10' minimum only.
4. The hunter shall provide a map, with boundaries outlined on the map of the property or properties of the approved site/platform.
5. No alcoholic beverages will be consumed by the hunter within eight (8) hours prior to the start of the hunt or consumed during the hunt.
6. The hunter may only use legal archery equipment as described in ORC 1501:31-15-11 unless otherwise stated in the special conditions section of this permit. The hunter shall provide proof of passing an archery proficiency test.
7. Anyone operating under this permit shall immediately remove carcass and entrails from the property covered under this permit, unless otherwise agreed upon by property owner. Animals may not be field dressed or transported in view of the general public.
8. Anyone operating under this permit shall only do so with the property owner's permission and shall immediately notify the Police Department at (216) 524-3911 if the animal being controlled under this permit leaves the property covered under this permit. The hunter may only retrieve the deer after obtaining that property owner's approval.
9. Anyone operating under this permit shall immediately notify the Police Department at (216) 524-3911 if the animal being controlled under this permit travels onto a public right of way or public property and requires further measures for harvesting. The Police Department will determine if assistance by the police department is required to retrieve the animal.
10. The property owner, the hunter, and the Chief of Police or his designee, shall review the property for suitability, concerns, stand placement, and boundaries. The Chief of Police or their designee may deem a property or any portion thereof unsuitable at any time if he/she determines it is in the best interest of the public. The Chief of Police or his designee's determination is final.
11. The property owner shall limit the number of hunters to a maximum of two (2) hunters at any one time on his/her property (2.25 acres) unless otherwise determined by the Chief of Police or his designee.
12. Hunter and property owner consent to the entry upon the hunting property by the City of Seven Hills' Police officers or Wildlife Officers to enforce the provisions of this chapter. The property owner shall notify hunter and the Seven Hills Police Department immediately if consent to hunt has been modified or revoked.
13. The hunter shall place their permit (bright colored paper with hunter's name and permit number issued by the Seven Hills Police Department) in the window of their vehicle at the beginning of each hunt. If the hunter is a resident of the property, and no vehicle is parked outside, the permit shall be placed in a front window of the home in a place likely to be seen by a Law Enforcement Officer or Wildlife Officer, at the beginning of each hunt.
14. Pursuant to city ordinance 505.11 Hunting, the Chief of Police or their designee may revoke or suspend this permit at any time if the permittee and/or any person operating under this permit violates any of the listed conditions of this permit or for any other reason deemed appropriate by the Chief of Police. The Chief of Police or his designee shall have the right to modify or change necessary provisions to allow qualified individuals to participate in this program. The Chief of Police's decision to grant, deny, or revoke a permit is a final decision which is not appealable.
15. By accepting this permit, the permittee accepts full responsibility for conducting all activities in a safe, legal and responsible manner and to indemnify and hold harmless the City of Seven Hills, its employees, officers, and agents from all liability associated with personal injury and/or property damage, loss and expense, including, but not limited to, damages, legal expenses and cost of defense in any matter arising from the permittee's archery activities.
16. Contact the Seven Hills Police Department (216-524-4423) no later than two weeks after the end of the hunting season to report all harvested animals (number and sex of animal even if it is zero). All harvested deer must be reported to the ODNR within the lawful amount of time. This can be done by visiting ODNR website www.wildlife.ohiodnr.gov or by calling 1-877-TAGITOH (1-877-824-4864).
17. The permit shall be used only by the named permit holder. The permit shall be valid only during the dates specified on the permit approval form.
18. The hunter shall post, "Caution Archery Hunting," signs if deemed necessary by the Chief of Police or his designee.
19. The hunter agrees to report any form of harassment to the City of Seven Hills Police Department (216)524-3911.
