Building Commissioner Grassi reported that while you were on recess the Building Department processed 140 permits, 39 contractor registrations, and responded to 33 property maintenance complaints, and that they also processed three new rental applications, and registered two new vacant properties. He stated that the new business Holy Smokes which is in the old PNC building has submitted permit applications, and construction documents for the interior renovation, and a new monument sign with plans on opening as soon as possible. The proposed new single family home dwelling at 3880 Pleasant Valley Road was withdrawn by the owner and the lot is back up for sale. Director Grassi said the two homes on Rockside Road east of Crossview Road have been demolished, and they are waiting for final inspections. He explained that the fire damaged home on Crossview Road has been demolished, and a new building permit has been issued for a new 2,500 square feet single family dwelling.
