A Message from Mayor Tony Biasiotta -

Dear Residents,

First and foremost, I hope that this newsletter finds everyone safe and healthy. Second, with the closing of the door on 2020 and the new year upon us, I hope that the healing process soon begins on all fronts. After witnessing our residents come together so many times in spite of so many challenges I have no doubt this will once again be the case.

Our City has literally weathered the storm. To start the year we experienced a 100-year rainfall. This summer, a very rare microburst hit the center of the city. To wrap up the year, the largest 24-hour snowfall in over 50 years blanketed our City. Our City has weathered the COVID impacts better than most. We have managed to keep all essential City services operating safely throughout the year. Further, we have been able to completely offset the financial hardships that were brought upon us from the pandemic.

At this time, the books have not closed on 2020, but we do forecast that we will end the year with general fund revenue exceeding expenses. We will be putting aside this surplus to help pay for expected 2021 infrastructure improvements.

Looking ahead to 2021, you will see robust infrastructure activity, economic development and not only the return, but also the addition of, new community events (as soon as it safe to do so).

The 2020 challenges did not slow our Partnerships and Progress goals down. Below are just a few of the seeds planted in 2020 that will come to fruition in 2021.

Partnerships: The City's request for resurfacing funds through the County 50/50 program was approved for Chestnut Rd. The City will get the maximum \$250,000 allowed under the program towards this project.

We continue to work with the NEORSD to restore the natural floodplain in the Donna Rae / Forest Overlook area. You can expect a few more homes to be cleared this spring as part of this project.

Last year we won the competitive county supplement grant for a gazebo to be built on Hillside and Broadview. We expect the new gazebo to be ready to serve the community this coming Memorial Weekend.

Further we have applied for two more county grants. The first is a block grant for \$150,000 towards new bathrooms, concessions and storage at Calvin park (by the ball fields). The other is a supplemental grant for \$50,000 towards a new community bus (The current bus is 19 years old, in poor shape and is not handicapped accessible).

For 2021, we have expanded our partnership with Cuyahoga County Public Works for additional sewer maintenance, cleaning and repairs. This partnership has enabled the City to perform significantly more sewer cleaning that we have ever in past as we have the ability to utilize the County's Sewer Trucks (you may have noticed them working 2nd shift in your neighborhood) and our own in-house sewer team.

Progress: Perhaps most exciting for me personally is the City has taken the initial steps to develop a master plan for our six City parks. With the passing of issue 41, the City will be undertaking major improvements to all our parks. This will be a long-term capital investment that we intend to phase in over the next three years. There will be many opportunities along the way for public feedback, and the major expenditures will all go to Council for approval.

In addition to the previously mentioned resurfacing of Chestnut we are prepared to resurface 10 additional streets this year. All together this represents approximately a \$2.6 million investment in our streets.

1. Elmhurst Drive (East Pleasant Valley to Evelyn)
2. Summitview Drive
3. East Clearview Avenue
4. East Decker Drive (Northview to E. Dartmoor)
5. East Hillsdale Avenue (W. 9th to Northview)
6. Glenella Drive
7. Jasmine Drive (H.N. 2938 To Western Terminus)
8. Karen Drive
9. South Main Hill Drive
10. Tanglewood Lane

Our water management task force continues to build upon the framework laid in 2020. Preliminary plans for this year (approximate investment \$2 million) include the following projects:

1. Replace the Cheryl Ann culvert and related repairs in the general area.
2. Lateral and additional spot repairs in the Firethorn, Bayberry and Bittersweet area.
3. Dredge and Clean Calvin Park and Somerset Lane retention basins.
4. Researching an additional water management device near Cresthill Drive

Economic Development: I'm very excited to announce that Erie Bank will be relocating their Northeast Ohio Regional Market Headquarters to Seven Hills. Erie Bank primarily operates as a commercial bank but does offer a full line of retail services as well. The new construction will be built north of Rockside Rd. west of Lombardo and east of Mural. **The facility will have 6,000 sq. ft and will employ roughly 20 people, bringing to Seven Hills a new payroll of north of \$1.5 million!**

The Rockside Rd. Project. This project was recently in news as the developer of record, Fairmount Properties, was noted for the COVID related developments at Pinecrest. I addressed the City via online memo in October but would like to take this opportunity to keep everyone informed (as this is the first City wide mailing since then). The private property in questions remains fully owned by LSB Seven Hills LLC. and LSB Seven Hills LLC has contracted with Fairmount Properties for the exclusive right to the develop the property. The City and the developer have already agreed to developments terms, terms that I believe were incredibly flexible on our behalf (with the interest of making the project as feasible as possible). Perhaps most importantly, we facilitated a \$39 million tax incentive, the most allowed by law for a project of this size. In short, the City has done absolutely everything it can to help get this project off the ground. The ball is firmly in the court of the developer at this point, and they (Fairmount Properties) continue to express their intent to develop the property.

Construction of the first ever Meijer in Cuyahoga County remains ahead of schedule. The last communicated target opening date from Meijer leadership was Memorial Weekend. However, we are all hopeful, given the status of construction, that this date could be moved up. Further great news related to the Meijer project (note this project was 100% privately financed), is that Seven Hills was able to take advantage of tax law to create a TIF/Economic development zone around this construction. What does this mean? It allows the City to recapture an estimated \$2.4 million (over 30 yrs) in new property tax revenue from the Meijer project that would have left our City for other tax agencies such as the port authority etc. This money will now be available to reinvest in Seven Hills infrastructure projects that hopefully will spur even greater investment in our City. With the opening of this store, another 300 jobs will come to the community. Check out <https://jobs.meijer.com/stores> to learn more about these opportunities.



Other expected openings in 2021 are Raising Canes at the Southeastern corner of Rockside Rd and Lombardo Center and the Dairy Queen Grill n Chill at the former Ruby Tuesday location.



Wrapping up, I hope you have seen the progress that started in 2020 all around town. As evidenced by the plans noted above, 2021 promises to be even more active on all fronts: streets, sewers, parks, new community events and new businesses. I leave you with the following: in spite of obstacles, morale is good at City Hall, we as a City are hitting on all cylinders, and we are doing it in a fiscally responsible manner.

SNOW REMOVAL

Throughout the winter season, it may become very difficult for students who walk to and from school to navigate through high accumulation of snow. If you are a homeowner within close proximity to Hillside Middle School, you are asked to help mitigate this hazard by doing your best to have your sidewalks cleared.

Some children will resort to walking down one of Seven Hills very busy streets because the sidewalks aren't cleared. This is very dangerous. For this reason we are asking all residents to do what they can to ensure the safety of our children.

Please be aware that C.O. 521.06 requires you to remove snow and ice from your side walks and C.O. 311.01 prohibits you from placing snow or ice onto a street or alley or obstructing or covering a fire hydrant. However, it is legal to operate powered snow removal equipment 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The entire ordinances can be viewed at www.sevenhillsohio.org.

THEFTS FROM VEHICLES

Thefts from unlocked vehicles continue to occur throughout the city. In each one of these cases, the vehicles entered were all unlocked and the thefts were committed overnight. The police department encourages all residents to keep all vehicles that are parked in your driveway locked and remove all valuables (for example, purses, wallets, laptops, GPS units, etc..) each night. Many of these thefts can be prevented by simply removing your valuables and locking your vehicles.

Remember, the people committing these crimes are simply walking through our neighborhoods and going through your vehicles. The police department wants to remind all residents to report any people acting in a suspicious manner immediately by calling our dispatch center at 216-524-3911. If you see anyone committing a criminal act (i.e. going through an unoccupied car in a driveway or on the street) immediately call 911 before taking any other action. Through cooperation and vigilance, we can continue to keep our neighborhoods safe.

PARKING HOURS

No person, operator or owner shall park or permit a vehicle to remain on the roadway portion of any street or highway in the City between the hours of 3:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. C.O. 351.11(a) can be viewed at www.sevenhillsohio.org.

FIRE DEPARTMENT



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM FIRE CHIEF MEKLEMBURG:

In May the residents of Seven Hills will be asked to vote on a 5 year renewal for our Fire Tax Levy. This renewal will cost a \$100,000 homeowner \$176.40 per year in property tax. This is a renewal levy, which means there will be **no increase** in what is currently being paid for fire and EMS services in the City of Seven Hills.

The money produced from this levy helps pay for the salaries of five part-time firefighters 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It also helps maintain and upgrade equipment that we use to help serve the residents of Seven Hills. Some different services that we provide, such as, child car seat installation, our residential Lock-Box program, fire prevention, and other public education initiatives would not be possible without this Levy.

With the continuing development of the City of Seven Hills we hope to continue providing the level of fire and EMS protection that our residents and business partners have grown to expect.

RETIREMENTS

On December 31, 2020 firefighter Danny Messich retired from the Seven Hills Fire Department after 30 years of service to the City of Seven Hills. Danny began his career with the department in June of 1990. During his time as a firefighter Danny was integral in bringing the Sparky the Dog program to the children of Seven Hills to help teach about fire safety. Danny plans on spending his retirement volunteering for many different organizations. We wish Danny and his family a retirement filled with health and happiness. Sunday morning breakfasts won't be the same without him.



On February 10, 2021 Lieutenant Steve Kordas Sr. will retire from the Seven Hills Fire Department after more than 40 years of service to the City of Seven Hills. Steve joined the department in February of 1980 and served as a firefighter until he was promoted to the position of Lieutenant in May of 2010. Over the course of his career Steve saw the department grow from the fully volunteer department that he began with to the fully staffed, part-time department that it is today. Steve plans on splitting his time between his house behind the fire station and Florida during retirement. We wish Lt. Kordas and his family nothing but the best during this next stage of his life.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Our Building Department remains accessible via walk up window outside of the Police Department entrance. We have placed a doorbell on the window frame to get our attention in case we do not see you at first.

Please be aware of snow removal requirement Ordinance 541.09 as it relates to Obstruction of Fire Hydrants. Hydrants need to have snow cleared away and not buried under by blowers and plows.



Contractors hired to maintain snow removal are required to be registered annually with the City of Seven Hills. They are required to maintain a surety bond and certificate of liability insurance according to Ordinance 1123. Snow Removal Contractors for Seniors can be obtained by contacting the Senior Coordinator at 216.525.6230.

We request that your contractor place snow on your own property and not in streets or on neighboring properties according to Ordinance 311.01. Also be courteous of mailmen and delivery companies having access to your porch and walks. This makes their job much easier.



FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Greetings from the Finance Department!

A message to property taxpayers regarding a change in the billing process for annual sewer maintenance fees: Prior to calendar year 2021, the City separately billed the residents for sewer maintenance on an annual basis. However, in an effort to provide more efficient and effective services, the Finance Department changed the method to bill and collect sewer maintenance charges.

Beginning with your 2021 property tax bills (for tax year 2020) issued by Cuyahoga County, you will notice a special assessment charge on your bill. The special assessment is the amount due for the City's sewer maintenance bill. Similar to your property taxes, the special assessment sewer maintenance fee will be billed in two halves. For example, if your current annual sewer bill from the City due in 2021 is for \$110, the County will assess 50%, or \$55, on the first half bill and the remaining 50%, or \$55, on the second half bill, for a total of \$110.

Please note that the special assessment charge is not a new tax or fee; rather, it is simply a change in the billing and collection method of the City's annual sewer maintenance fee. You will not receive a separate annual sewer maintenance bill from the City of Seven Hills.

Current rates have been effective since June 1, 2018, and are calculated as follows:

Description	Rate
Sanitary Sewer Maintenance Fee	\$0.40 per front foot per lot per year
Storm Sewer Maintenance Fee	\$0.95 per front foot per lot per year

*** Hemlock Creek Watershed Utility Improvement Project – REMINDER:
The new sanitary sewer main is available for connecting to! * * ***

Attention affected property owners / residents on **Hillside Drive, Cherry Lane, Nemet Drive, Twilight Drive, Shady Lane, North Mary Lane, Mary Lane, South Mary Lane, Seven Hills Boulevard, and Oak Lane:**

NOTE: For property owners who have not yet connected their homes to the new sanitary sewer, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health will be mailing you a second notice letter containing specific information and requirements sometime in January or February of 2021.

As you are likely aware, many residents have already connected to the new sanitary sewer and have had their septic systems properly abandoned.

As a reminder, the information packet (“*SANITARY SEWER - SERVICE LINE INSTALLATION INFORMATION*”) provided at the February 29, 2020 meeting is available online at <http://www.sevenhillsohio.org/en-US/Hemlock-Creek.aspx>. Since this packet provides permit requirements and details, you are encouraged to let your Contractor know that the information packets are available online.

All property owners / residents should have received by U.S. Mail a City of Seven Hills “Public Sanitary Sewer Availability” letter dated April 10, 2020.

At this time, your City-registered Contractor can apply for the required City Building Permit.

All property owners should have been notified via U.S. Mail by the Cuyahoga County Board of Health with the official connection notice. This letter is considered your official order from the Board to connect to the sanitary sewer and properly abandon your septic tank as per Ohio Administrative Code Section 3701-29-06(I) under the authority vested in Ohio Revised Code Sections 3709.21 and 3718.10.

Please note, final assessment costs are currently being calculated and finalized. Final assessment costs will be available in the near future.

Please be mindful of neighboring properties who may be having construction work performed for connecting to the new sanitary sewer.

Various construction equipment may be operating in the nearby vicinity.

Use common sense to ensure that children (and adults) keep away from all construction equipment whether it is operating or not.

*** * * Broadview Road Traffic Signal (for new Meijer Project, former K-Mart site) * * ***

Be aware of a new permanent traffic light installation near 7701 Broadview Road in late Winter / early Spring 2021!

- The lowest & best bid was awarded to Signal Service Company by City Council, per Ord. No. 60-2020 on July 28, 2020 in the amount of not to exceed \$114,392.34. Please note, this Project, in its entirety, is being funded by Meijer Stores Limited Partnership per the Development Agreement of July 3, 2019 between the City of Seven Hills and Meijer Stores Limited Partnership. The City of Seven Hills Engineering Department is administering the Project.
- Final Completion for construction is anticipated no later than March 2021.

PLEASE NOTE: For a 3 week period before the traffic light is fully functioning and is operational, the travelling public will be made aware via required road signage, along Broadview Road both Northbound and Southbound, that a new traffic signal will soon be in operation.



ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

***** 2020/2021 Sewer Rehabilitation – Bayberry Area *****

AECOM, an Engineering Consultant hired by the City, provided a Sewer Investigative Report dated September 25, 2020. The Report documented the 11 streets street portions studied that included Tanglewood Lane, Bayberry Drive, Driftwood Drive, Primrose Drive, Firethorn Drive, Bittersweet Drive, Panorama Drive, Waxberry Drive, St. Maron Drive, Skyview Drive, and Broadview Road. The purpose of the Report was to help identify & eliminate sources of inflow & infiltration within the public sanitary sewers. As a result, there are 8 streets where public sanitary sewers where work will be occurring this winter into the summer as follows:

- Streets (3) where sanitary sewers will be cleaned: **Waxberry Drive, Driftwood Drive, and Bittersweet Drive**
- Streets (5) where sanitary sewers will be cleaned and lined: **Panorama Drive, Firethorn Drive, Primrose Drive, Bayberry Drive, and Tanglewood Drive.**

The Engineering Department has solicited for public bids for this Project. The following are some additional notes on the Project:

- The Engineer’s Estimated Cost for Construction for the Project is \$348,249.00.
- The Bid Opening is Tuesday, January 5, 2021 (not yet occurred as of the date of this writing...).
- The lowest & best bid will be awarded in January 2021 with project commencement in February or March 2021.
- There will be no major construction being performed that would affect vehicular traffic and/or general disturbances for the residents along the 8 streets.
- Work is anticipated to last up to 180 days. Further information & notification will be provided to residents on the 8 streets by the Contractor performing the work.

***** 2021 Road Program *****

There are 12 streets are getting rehabilitated and resurfaced for the 2021 construction season (see chart to the right):

Also included in the 2021 Road Program is the City-owned parking lot located at the Northeast corner of the Broadview Road / Hillside Road intersection where a new gazebo will be built this year. The parking lot is approximately 9,100 square feet.

The Engineering Department is currently preparing the design and bid specifications for the 2021 Road Program with anticipation of publicly bidding the Project in February/March 2021. Construction is planned to commence in May/June 2021.

***** Cheryl Ann Drive Culvert Improvements *****

As of the date of this writing, the Cheryl Ann Drive Culvert plans and specifications are nearly finalized to completely rehabilitate the existing 108-inch storm sewer culvert pipe that crosses under Cheryl Ann Drive.

It is anticipated that the Project will be publicly bid in February/March 2021 with construction to commence in mid-to-late Spring 2021.

Emergencies after hours

Contact Seven Hills Dispatch at 216-524-3911. Dispatch will contact the Service Department to handle City related issues such as snow removal, sewers backing up, flooding, downed trees and dead animals.

For Medical and other emergencies dial 911.

Mailboxes

The Service Department will make repairs to mailboxes that have been directly hit by the snowplows. Typically, damage is a result of the snow hitting the mailbox and not direct contact with the plow. Please check the condition of your mailbox in preparation for snowfall. Anything loose, broken or rotted mailboxes needs to be replaced.

Snow Removal

One truck is assigned in every ward for snow removal. However, additional trucks may be used depending on the amount of snowfall. Main streets and hills are a priority followed by the side streets and subdivisions. The City typically plows and salts only the intersections, hills and curves as part of our salt sensibility program which has been in effect for years.

Rubbish Pickup

Rubbish should be placed on the tree lawn by 7:00AM on the scheduled day of collection and shall not be placed earlier than 4:00PM on the day prior to the scheduled date of collection. See holiday schedule on back page of newsletter.

Water Main Breaks

Should you notice bubbling or streaming water along the roadway or tree lawn, please call the Cleveland Water Department at 216-664-3060 to report the break.

Street Light Outages

To report a street light outage, broken fixture or light flickering please call The Illuminating Company at 1-888-544-4877 or the Service Department at 216-525-6225.

Document Shred Day

The City will have document shredding behind City Hall on April 20th, June 15th and August 17th from 1PM to 7PM. Shred-it will be doing on site shredding.

Household Hazardous Waste & Computer Roundup

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Winter Safety Precautions for Seniors

When outside:

- Dress warmly in loose fitting clothes, layering when possible. Favor mittens over gloves as fingers generate warmth as they rub against each other.
- During cold weather always wear a head cover, as 30-50% of body heat is lost through the head.
- A scarf or mouth covering will help to protect lungs against cold air.



Frostbite and hypothermia: Most susceptible body parts are fingers, toes, ear lobes and noses. Symptoms of frostbite include numbness and a white cast to the skin in the affected area. Warm body parts quickly, but be careful not to scald.

The most common signs and symptoms of hypothermia are:

- Uncontrolled shiver
- Slow or slurred speech
- A sense of exhaustion
- Stumbling
- Memory loss
- Drowsiness

If you or someone you know is experiencing these signs, get medical help immediately, but if that's not possible, try to warm the victim gradually, help them change into warm, dry clothing and then cover with a blanket, making sure to cover the head and neck as well. Hypothermia can develop in days or weeks, so keep an eye on loved ones.

Keep hydrated!

If forced to shovel snow take frequent breaks. Listen to your body. If you're tired, rest! Make sure shoes have a good rubber tread to avoid slips and falls. If canes and walkers are utilized, make sure rubber tips are in good condition.

When inside:

Keep thermostat set at least 65 degrees to prevent hypothermia.

Inexpensive plastic sheeting over windows will help insulate the home.

Kits are available at Wal-Mart and Target as well as most hardware stores.

Make sure smoke detectors are in good working order and replace used batteries with fresh ones.

For seniors who utilize fuel-burning heaters, fireplaces and appliances, be on the safe side and purchase carbon monoxide detectors. Remember, carbon monoxide is colorless and odorless.

Finally, ensure that you or a loved one is fully stocked with medications, medicines, food and water, in addition to making sure they have adequate heat. Following these winter precautions will help ensure that you and your loved ones stay as comfortable and healthy during the winter season as possible.

Together, we can build a stronger nation, working toward the grand aspirations of our Constitution, promoting fairness for all, seeking peaceful coexistence with each other, caring for the needy, and ensuring that everyone has the equal protection of the government.

Our Constitution assures that freedom and fairness will be guaranteed for ourselves and future generations. This is a major reason why it has served our nation so well for two and a half centuries and why we have every reason to expect that our nation will overcome our current challenges, stronger yet, “A More Perfect Union...securing the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity.”

Hello Seven Hills Residents:

Happy New Year 2021! Like many, I am happy to be turning the page on 2020. May the New Year Bless our residents with health, prosperity and good times.

While 2020 was an extremely difficult year, both economically and socially, we have a great many things to look forward to this new year. Here are just some of the things Council is focused on in 2021:

°Council recently approved legislation for the bidding process to begin on our 2021 roads program. This year the focus will be on re-surfacing eleven (11) streets within our community.

°On December 29, 2020, Council approved Resolution 39-2020 which allows for the application of a Supplemental Grant Program with Cuyahoga County in the amount of \$50,000.00. If these funds are awarded to our City, it would enable us to purchase a well needed Community Services Vehicle to replace our failing 2001 model.

°On December 29, 2020, Council approved Ordinance 108-2020 which allows the City to partner with Brandstetter Carroll, an architectural firm, to develop a Parks Master Plan. Brandstetter Carroll will assist City leaders to help establish long term planning and goals to updating the parks within the Community.

°On the upcoming Council Agenda, Council will be voting on a Resolution to apply for a 2021 Municipal Grant with Cuyahoga County. If passed by Council and the funds are awarded to our City, the proceeds will be allocated to the construction of a new concession stand at Calvin Park.

More good things to look forward to in 2021.....

°The opening of Meijer's scheduled to take place in May,

°The future construction of Erie Bank's Headquarters located on Rockside Road,

°The future construction of the new Dairy Queen Grill and Chill (at former Ruby Tuesday property) and

°The future construction of Raising Cane's on Rockside Road (located in front of Vitalia-Omni Senior Living)

Despite the challenges that came with 2020, as a City we have made adjustments to conform to a new and unconventional way of doing business, while still moving the City forward. Council will closely monitor the budget and will continue to work closely with the Mayor and his Administration to bring all projects to fruition. As a Council we remain focused and steadfast to the needs of our residents and look forward to all the great things coming our way.

Good by and Good Riddance 2020. The most tense and controversial year since 1968.

Even with all the Covid baggage that has been heaped on the Biasiotta administration we have still managed to move forward keeping the city finances well in the black. There are some promising developments for 2021. The funding authorization process has begun for our 2021 road program and at long last (fingers crossed) it looks like Karen Drive will be repaved. Additionally the "stub end" of Seven Hills Blvd that runs from Starlight to Calvin Park has been added to the program at my request. This was a section that was adversely impacted by the Hemlock project and really should have been included in the 2019 road program.

Hemlock residents have continued to hook up their lateral lines and even with the long delays by excavators getting to this work it is progressing. Remember the Engineering Department has an extensive list of qualified excavators and any qualified excavator can do this work as long as they are registered with the Building Department.

All residents, Please note that on your property tax bill you are likely to see a notion for "special assessments". This is for the city sewer maintenance bill. Council has decided to let the county do the billing for us on this fee as it less expensive to do this than have our own Finance Department do it, so be aware. Also this is a fee, not a tax and unlike past years it will be split between the two half year property tax bills.

I am pleased to announce that council has authorized the Service Department to spend monies out of the Tree Fund to plant trees in the city right of way. There are still many details to be worked out but I am hopeful that we will see some activity on this renewal program in the spring.

That's all I can think of right now. Please God let us all survive the winter and make it to our Covid vaccination in the Spring.

Police Department

The Police Department of Seven Hills was founded in 1927. At that time, it was a one-man force. The man was known as the town Marshall, and from 1927 until 1940, the man in that position received \$25.00 a year for his services. As the department grew, the police chief served a triple job. Besides acting as chief, he served as road foreman and custodian of the Town Hall.

The department grew along with the Village of Seven Hills. More policemen were hired, and more equipment purchased. The first official police vehicle was purchased in 1930. In 1937, the Village built its first jail, and in 1939, it purchased its first motorcycle. The first police radio was installed in 1941. In 1954, the Village had 24-hour protection. Two police cars were in operation as of 1956.

In 1961, when Seven Hills became a city, the police department consisted of 1 chief, 1 sergeant, 4 patrolmen, 1 part-time police woman, and 3 part time policemen. In addition to the fulltime department, an auxiliary department, consisting of 20 volunteer officers, assisted full-time officers with traffic, parades, special events, and other assignments.

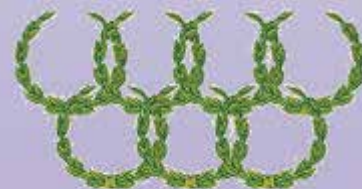

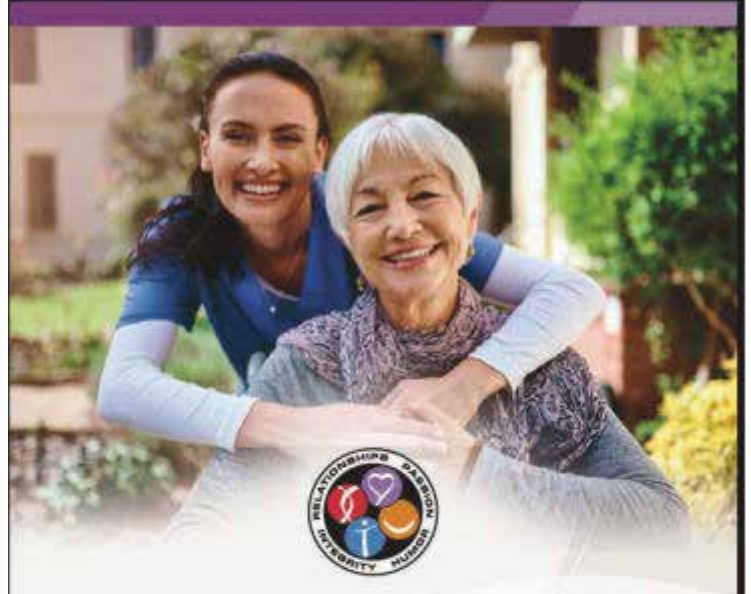

LEARN-TO-SWIM LEVEL DESCRIPTIONS

- **Starfish:** 6 months to 3 years old. The STARFISH level builds readiness by emphasizing fun in the water. Parents and children will participate in several guided sessions which help children adjust to the water and learn basic water skills. Most importantly, it's fun for parents and kids!
- **Tadpole (Pre-School #1):** Group TADPOLE is for children who are being introduced to the swimming pool for the first few times. The main focus of this level is to become comfortable in the swimming pool. In order for your swimmer to progress to the next level, these tasks must be completed: Independently enters and exits the water; Kicks feet at the wall; Blows bubbles; Holds breath when face is underwater; Submerges underwater with assistance; Swims away from wall with assistance; Demonstrates comfort in pool setting; Understands Pool Safety Rules.
- **Frog (Preschool #2):** Group FROG is for the beginner swimmer who is familiar with the water. Swimmers will learn the fundamentals of swimming as well as pool safety. At the completion of level FROG, the swimmer will be able to complete the following: Front float with little or no assistance; Back float with little or no assistance; Paddles on front and back with assistance; Kicks on front and back with assistance; Holds breath underwater for 3 seconds; Submerges unassisted; 5 yards assisted streamline from wall on front and back; Log rolls assisted; Independent bobs.
- **Stingray (Preschool #3):** Group STINGRAY is for swimmers who have either completed Preschool 2, have recommendation from teacher to move into Preschool 3, or have intermediate skills. Children have already mastered kicking and pulling independently, floating unassisted, kicking on kickboard with little to no assistance, and jumping in and swimming back to the wall 5 feet. Children will work on backstroke, swimming 5 to 10 yards independently with rudimentary breathing, intro to dolphin kick, and streamline kicking 5 yards front and back.
- **Turtle (Level #1):** Group TURTLE is for the swimmer who has completed group FROG or can float unassisted and swim rudimentary freestyle. At the completion of level TURTLE, your swimmer will be able to complete the following: Front and back float unassisted; Freestyle and backstroke 5 yards assisted; Streamline kick on front and back unassisted 5 yards; Log rolls unassisted; Assisted rotary breathing; Assisted side-kick; 10 Independent bobs.
- **Penguin (Level #2):** Group PENGUIN is for the swimmer who has completed group TURTLE. In Group PENGUIN, swimmers will learn to swim freestyle with rotary breathing, backstroke, and will be introduced to dolphin and breaststroke kicks. In order to advance to the next level, the following must be completed: 10-15 yards Unassisted freestyle with rotary breathing; 10-15 yards Backstroke unassisted; 10-15 yards Streamline kick on front and back; Dolphin kicks assisted; Jumps in and swims to the wall unassisted; 15 Independent bobs.
- **Sea Otter (Level #3):** Group SEA OTTER is for swimmers ready to advance their swimming skills. In Group SEA OTTER, swimmers will enhance freestyle and backstroke, and continue to learn butterfly and breaststroke. In order to advance to the Dolphins pre-team group, the following must be completed: 25 yards Freestyle and backstroke; 25 yards Streamline kick front and back; 10 yards Unassisted streamline butterfly kick; Butterfly arms; 5 yards Unassisted breaststroke kick; 5 yards Butterfly.
- **Dolphin (Level #4 - 6):** The DOLPHIN group is a pre-team swim group consisting of swimmers who have completed Sea Otter swim lessons. This pre-team group is for swimmers looking to strengthen their swimming skills and learn the fundamentals of swim team. Swimmers entering the pre-team group must be able to complete the following: 25 yards Freestyle with rotary breathing; 25 yards Backstroke; 5 yards Butterfly; Breaststroke kick.

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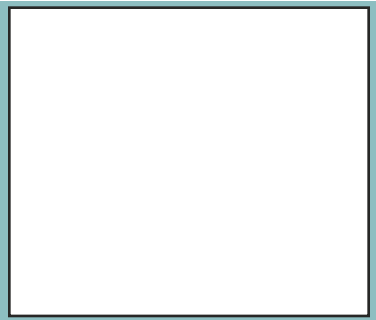

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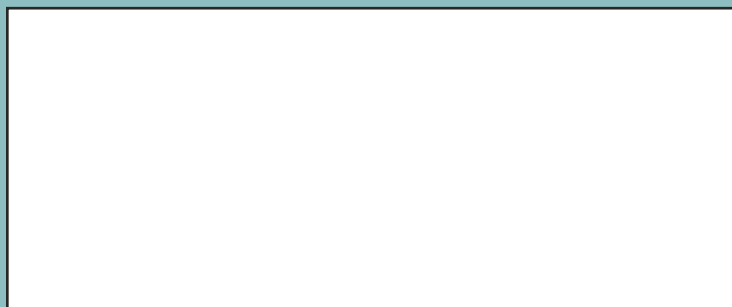
