Dear Residents,

Welcome to the Winter edition of our quarterly newsletter – our first for 2023. I want to start this edition by wishing everyone a healthy and happy new year. Next, I would like to share with you a quote from Benjamin Franklin — "Be at war with your vices, at peace with your neighbors, and let every new year find you a better [person]." I thought this quote was applicable to our community as we find ourselves saying goodbye to a very productive 2022 and look forward to an even better 2023.

## May Ballot Issue

City Council will be placing a refuse disposal levy <u>renewal</u> on the May ballot. <u>This renewal will not increase taxes</u>. The funds generated from this levy, plus the current balance in our refuse fund will completely cover our recently passed 5-year contract with Waste Management. The contract with Waste Management will run from 2023-2027 and the levy will run from 2024-2028.

## **Finance**

Financially speaking, we once again finished the year in good shape. We wrapped up the year with an approximate \$1,000,000 general fund surplus that was ultimately transferred to our capital fund. We most likely will put these funds towards our 2023 road program. Moody's continues to assign us a rating of Aa3. The rating indicates the City's debt obligations are of high quality and subject to very low credit risk. The higher the rating, the lower interest rates on new debt issues, which helps save taxpayer dollars. Think of it as an individual's credit score.

I will take a deeper dive into our finances in this years State of City, to be mailed out in late spring.

## Parks and Recreation

Our master plan continues to move forward. Our volleyball courts have been renovated and improved. Playground equipment was added to Cricket Park. Bocce Courts were completed in Summitview Commons (City Hall by the pavilion). These courts can also serve our upcoming cornhole leagues. If you are interested in joining our spring / summer bocce leagues, please check out the League Play page of this newsletter and stay tuned for cornhole info later this spring. Outdoor fitness equipment is being added to North Park and lighting was restored to our horseshoe pits at Calvin.

Phase 1 of the Parks Master Plan is nearly complete. ADA accessible bathrooms have been added to Meijer, Summitview Commons, Calvin, and John Glenn Parks. An outdoor pavilion was also added to John Glenn Park as well. The major component of Phase 1B, the Lodge at North Park (all season pavilion), will break ground this winter. Phase 2, which includes the Splash Pad at Calvin, should break ground in the spring with the final phase, Phase 3 to commence in late summer/ early fall. These improvements represent only an approximate 40% of the overall plan. I will use the State of the of City address to get further into all the detail.

## **Economic Development**

Unfortunately, we were informed by the private property owner on Rockside Rd., LSB Seven Hills LLC., that they, yet again, are looking for a new development partner. The developer, Industrial Commercial Properties, in a note to the property owner blamed inflation and high interest rates as the reason for their decision not to move forward. The property owner has notified the City that they will continue negotiations with other developers. I will keep you posted as the owners share more information about their plans.

On a positive note, Raising Cane's is scheduled to break ground in winter 2023. In 2022, we welcomed the opening of the new Dairy Queen Grill N Chill, Boss ChickN Beer, Charleys Cheesesteaks and Wings, and Erie Bank's district offices.

## Partnerships and Progress

We continue to be highly successful in our partnership's efforts. Since we last spoke, Cuyahoga County Council awarded Seven Hills a \$250,000 grant. This grant was

funded through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). These funds were specifically granted to be applied to our new all-seasons pavilion.



# MAYOR'S MESSAGE (CONTINUED)



## Infrastructure

Our water task force continues to work on multiple upgrades. Next up is further drainage improvements along the eastern edge of Calvin Park, and then the dredging of Driftwood Basin.

Our 2023 Road Resurfacing Program is already in motion. Streets to be resurfaced this year include Bryant Lane, St. Francis Drive, Applewood Drive, Cricket Lane (north of Jasmine Drive), Somerset Lane, E. Parkhaven Drive, Greenlawn Drive, Lotus Lane, Justo Lane, S. Cricket Lane, and Jasmine Drive. This represents another \$2.2 million investment in our roads.

In addition, several roads will receive repairs performed by our Service Department: Alla Drive, E. Dawnwood Drive, Pleasant Run Drive, Winchester Drive, Wynde Tree Drive and Bonroi Drive.

I'm going to wrap up with a popular new year's toast "Here's to a bright New Year and a fond farewell to the old; here's to the things that are yet to come, and to the memories that we hold."

#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

Throughout the winter season, it may become very difficult for students who walk to and from school to navigate through high accumulation of snow. If you are a homeowner within close proximity to Hillside Middle School, you are asked to help mitigate this hazard by doing your best to have your sidewalks cleared.



Some children will resort to walking down one of Seven Hills very busy streets because the sidewalls aren't cleared. This is very dangerous. For this reason we are asking all residents to do what they can to ensure the safety of our children.

Please be aware that C.O. 521.06 requires you to remove snow and ice from your side walks and C.O. 311.01 prohibits you from placing snow or ice onto a street or alley or obstructing or covering a fire hydrant. However, it is legal to operate powered snow removal equipment 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. ## THEFTS FROM VEHICLES - PLEASE KEEP YOUR VEHICLES LOCKED

Thefts from unlocked vehicles continue to occur throughout the city. In each one of these cases, the vehicles entered were all unlocked and the thefts were committed overnight. The police department encourages all residents to keep all vehicles that are parked in your driveway locked and remove all valuables (for example, purses, wallets, laptops, GPS units, etc..) each night. Many of these thefts can be prevented by simply removing your valuables and locking your vehicles.



Remember, the people committing these crimes are simply walking through our neighborhoods and going through your vehicles. The police department wants to remind all residents to report any people acting in

a suspicious manner immediately by calling our dispatch center at 216-524-3911. If you see anyone committing a criminal act (i.e. going through an unoccupied car in a driveway or on the street) immediately call 911 before taking any other action. Through cooperation and vigilance, we can continue to keep our neighborhoods safe.

## WASTE AND GARBAGE CONTAINER REQUIREMENTS

Trash containers shall be removed promptly after collection but in no case shall remain on the tree lawn overnight after the day of collection. The trash container shall be stored in a building or if stored in the open shall be placed behind the building front setback line and not visible from street. ## SNOW FENCES & SNOW REMOVAL

As the weather begins to change please be aware of the **Snow Fence Ordinance** Requirements **Section 521.07** and **Section 997.04**.

Please remember to keep sidewalks clear of snow and ice for the safety of everyone. Snow removal must be kept on your own property.

If you are a contractor doing snow removal in the City for our residents on their property. Please be sure to have your company registered with the Building Department prior to snow plow season.

**Emergencies After Hours** 

Contact Seven Hills Dispatch at 216-524-3911. Dispatch will contact the Service Department to handle City related issues such as snow removal, sewers backing up, flooding, downed trees and dead animals. For Medical and other emergencies dial 911.



#### Mailboxes

The Service Department will make repairs to mailboxes that have been directly hit by the snowplows. Typically, damage is a result of the snow hitting the mailbox and not direct contact with the plow. Please check the condition of your mailbox in preparation for snowfall. Anything loose, broken or rotted mailboxes needs to be replaced.

#### Snow Removal

One truck is assigned in every ward for snow removal. However, additional trucks may be used depending on the amount of snowfall. Main streets and hills are a priority followed by the side streets and subdivisions. The City typically plows and salts only the intersections, hills and curves as part of our salt sensibility program which has been in effect for years.



Rubbish Pickup - NEW LIMIT

Four (4) additional bags or cans (35-gallon, 40 pound limit), allowed outside the cart. Bags or cans may be filled with trash, yard waste or construction debris. ONLY 4 Allowed.

**NEW LIMIT** - WM will pick up no more than 2 bulk items on your regular trash collection day. Please schedule your bulk pick to ensure it is collected.

## Bulk items include:

- Carpet please cut, roll and tie in lengths no greater than 4 ft.
- Appliances remove appliance doors and Freon (Freon must be removed or WM will not collect)
- · Large screen TVs 42" and up
- Furniture, mattresses and/or box springs must be wrapped in plastic with duct tape
- Lumber bundle and tie wood products in lengths no longer than 3 feet and 40 pounds. Lumber such as  $2 \times 4$  to be bundled and tied in lengths or 36 inches and 40 pounds
- If the truck picking up your trash leaves the bulk item, a separate truck will be sent to collect it.
- Bulky Construction debris is limited to 2 bundles of 40 pounds x 48 inches or two items such as 2 cabinet fixtures.

Rubbish should be placed on the tree lawn by 7:00AM on the scheduled day of collection and shall not be placed earlier then 4:00PM on the day prior to the scheduled date of collection. Schedule a bulk pickup by calling Waste Management at 866-797-9018 or the Service Department at 216-525-6225.

#### Water Main Breaks

Should you notice bubbling or streaming water along the roadway or tree lawn, please call the Cleveland Water Department at 216-664-3060 to report the break.

#### Street Light Outages

To report a street light outage, broken fixture or light flickering please call The Illuminating Company at 1-888-544-4877 or the Service Department at 216-525-6225.

#### **Document Shred Day**

The City will have document shredding behind City Hall on April 18th, and August 15th from 1PM to 7PM. Shred-it will be doing on site shredding.

#### Household Hazardous Waste & Computer Roundup

The City will have a roundup on May 16th from 8AM – 6PM and September 19th from 8AM-6PM behind City Hall. For more information, please contact the Service Department at 216-525-6225 or check the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District Website: www.cuyahogarecycles.org



#### Tires

The city will collect tires 20 inches or less at the Household and Hazardous Waste Roundup on September 19th from 8am - 6pm behind City Hall. Tires must be off the rim.

The Engineering Department is working with owners of privately owned stormwater management facilities (detention or retention basins) to ensure that they are being maintained properly. Work has started on a few basins to come into compliance, but many more require attention. The Engineering Department will be working yearly to ensure compliance so that these stormwater management facilities function as they were intended to do.

The City partners with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) and Cuyahoga Soil & Water Conservation District (CSWCD) to assist with the management of stormwater in our City. ## Surgical Treatment for Atrial Fibrillation Restores UH Patient's Energy

Joe Timko of Broadview Heights figured he was just growing old, with a persistent heaviness in his chest that left him feeling sluggish. He didn't realize he had atrial fibrillation (AFib), the most common heart rhythm disorder and one experienced unknowingly by millions of Americans.

After a surgical ablation at University Hospitals Parma Medical Center, Timko has newfound energy.

AFib is caused by disorganized electrical impulses in the chambers of the heart. These uneven and often rapid impulses cause "quivering" in the atria and can leave a patient feeling like their heart is racing or even slowed down – and some people, like Joe, don't feel it at all. This abnormality in the atria, or upper chambers of the heart, may prevent it from pushing enough blood into the ventricles, or lower chambers of the heart. Such sluggish blood flow means the heart isn't pumping effectively, and can cause heart failure over time or blood clots that lead to stroke.

"AFib just wears your heart out," says UH cardiac surgeon, Gregory Rushing, MD, who offers surgical ablation for patients with long-standing, persistent AFib that has lasted more than one year and who have failed other treatments.

AFib can present in a variety of ways. While irregular heart rhythms may be persistent or permanent for some patients, others may experience intermittent AFib, which can occur suddenly, last seconds, minutes or even hours, and may resolve on its own. But it is no less concerning and can be dizzying and scary for a person unaware of what's happening.

The majority of people with AFib don't even know their heart is malfunctioning this way. Timko learned about his AFib during a routine physician office visit.

"Actually, when heart palpitations are not present, the majority of patients' symptoms are not attributed to the heart," Dr. Rushing said. "They show up at their doctor's office for a cholesterol evaluation, or to get ready for a colonoscopy, and AFib is an incidental finding."

Surgical ablation uses either heat or cold energy to electrically isolate the tissue of a small part of the heart to stop its quivering. Surgery takes two forms: either traditional open heart surgery, or a newer minimally invasive approach, in which a cardiac surgeon uses special cameras and catheters to ablate or correct AFib using small incisions.

This procedure, which involves only an overnight stay in the hospital and a few weeks of recovery, has an 85 percent success rate, Dr. Rushing said. As long as the patient has not undergone previous cardiac surgery, they may be a candidate.

"I run up and down the steps now," said Timko, who had his surgical ablation at UH Parma Medical Center. "I feel I can do almost anything again.

"I had felt old, like this was the way I was going to be the rest of my days, sitting in my recliner watching TV. Now, if you ask me to do something, I'll say, 'Let's go.' I have energy I didn't even realize I was missing."

## "Let it Snow, Let it Snow, Let it Snow" Seven Hills Ward 2 Residents are ready!

Hello residents of Ward 2. We are all in the middle of winter! So...do you prefer the **Dean Martin** or the **Frank Sinatra** version of the song "Let it Snow?" Snow clearing can be a challenge, but for those first few hours—when the snow is falling and has just settled, gently, onto the ground, you won't find a more beautiful sight.



Snow Plowing - Investing for Today and the Future in the City of Seven Hills

Why paint a house or fix a roof? It's worth it because it pays benefits for years and years. It is an investment in your home. It's easy to not fix something and go buy a pizza, but it is not the

responsible thing to do.

Removing snow from the city's four wards, (including ward 2) is an expensive process and a top investment priority for the City of Seven Hills. Without snow plowing of our 58 miles of streets, you and I as residents are potentially at risk. How about driving the curve and hill on Chestnut in snow conditions? Or the long sloping hill on Crossview, or the heavily travelled Ridgewood? That risk can come in the form of:

EMS and fire can't get to a neighborhood unless the roads are clear of snow and fallen trees Police can't respond quickly unless those same roadways are clear.

You and I can't get to work or possibly to get to a medical appointment.

Planning to Succeed

Providing quality snow plowing of our city's streets requires planning when the sun is shining at the beginning of summer. The City of Seven Hills administration and this council has invested heavily into updating our roadways by using an engineering review to prioritize which roadways will see asphalt overlays each year. Upon the recommendation of the Mayor, and the approval of city council, over \$1,200,000 has been recently transferred into the capital improvement budget due to a fortunate budget surplus during fiscal year 2022. The roadways with the greatest repair needs are identified and improved. Smoother roads reduce plow-blade damage and road surface damage. Future newsletter articles will outline this summer's road improvement program.

Planning for Equipment

Purchasing equipment can be a multiyear process. A fully equipped plow-truck-and blade can cost upward of \$360,000 (each). The city has placed its newest plow-truck into operation that was ordered in 2021 and city council is supporting acquiring another plow-truck in 2023. The trucks cannot salt the streets without salt. It takes procurement of salt at the best consortium market price available. It requires an enclosure to protect the salt from moisture. Most importantly It requires functioning heavy duty front-end loaders (\$122,000) and backhoes (\$80,000) to pick the salt up and transfer it to the plow truck quickly and reliably in the middle of the storm.

**It takes more than trucks.** It requires planning. Cleaning ditches and culverts in the fall ensures melt water can be carried away from the road surface effectively. Planning means having back -up fuel supplies and generators to ensure the pumps can get fuel to the equipment when there is a widespread power outage. Plowing snow is rough on equipment and on our 13 CDL certified drivers. Our crews and equipment maintenance employees are our number one asset. They work in frigid temperatures, difficult visibility, and long hours. We all thank them for their dedication of leaving their families to ensure our Ward 2 resident's safety and for the safety of the entire city.

Clearing snow is neither cheap nor easy. It requires getting things done and done well ahead of the falling snow-flakes. So our road department says "let it snow, let it snow".... they are ready to GO GO GO! What Can You Do?

Have patience. Drive safely, if you must drive at all. Get your car and truck off the street! Finally, please keep the snow from your driveway off the street.

So...Who sang it best, Dean or Frank? I say Dean, but others may say the contemporary stylings of singers such as Michael Bublé, Rod Stewart, Billy Idol, Blake Shelton, or Jessica Simpson may be more their style. Regardless, enjoy the snows of winter!

# SEVEN HILLS HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Our purpose is to preserve and promote the unique heritage of the City of Seven Hills. We hope to instill appreciation of past generations as well as provide enjoyment, education and inspiration for current and future generations. This will be accomplished through such activities as research, publications, acquisitions, and conservation of materials, advocacy of historic landmarks and educational opportunities.

# BEGINNING OF SEVEN HILLS

On February 26, 1927, the Village of Seven Hills officially came in existence as an independence municipality. On January 4, 1961 the Village was proclaimed a City. This area including Cleveland itself was part of the territory called the Western Reserve of Northern Ohio. It was designated for exploration and development by the Connecticut Land company of the State of Connecticut in 1795. The Western Reserve was divided into a number of townships, one of which was Independence Township.

As the area became more settled, sections in the eastern part broke away from Independence Township and became Garfield Heights and Valley View. Then in 1914 Independence moved to become incorporated as a village itself. However, not all the residents were in favor of the idea. The split in opinion led to a split in the township, so that only the eastern area, center around the Independence town square and town hall became incorporated as the Village of Independence Township.

Speculation has it that the farming residents of the area were wary of the municipal incorporation, fearing that it would change the nature of their rural community, but in the years following, this line of thoughts began to change.

Finally, on June 12, 1926 area residents presented a petition to the County Commissioners requesting incorporation as the Village of Seven Hills. The request was granted on September 1, 1926, and became effective on February 26, 1927. Henry Froehlich, who had been a Township Trustee, became the first Mayor. A school house at Broadview and Hillside, built in 1861, became the village hall. A new front was built onto it in 1931, and then a fire house was added to the northside of the building in 1937, as a Public Works Administration Project.

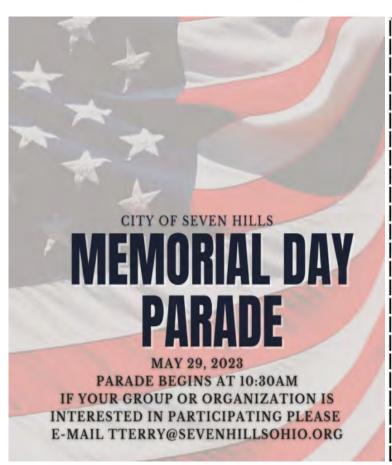

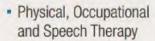

## Group Descriptions

- Starfish: For ages 6 months to 3 years old, this level builds readiness by emphasizing fun in the water. The Parent/Guardian and children will participate together in several guided sessions which help children adjust to the water and learn basic water skills.
